■ Promotion of Student-Mobility Environment

Utilizing the Overseas Study Assistance System of the Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO), we also received scholarship support for dispatched students from the Fukushima Hamadori TRIDEC, a general incorporated association.

■ Internationalization of the university, Information disclosure and Publication of outcome For the dispatch of Japanese students in the fiscal year 2023, we held a send-off ceremony in February 2024, which was also open to the media. Additionally, in June 2024 we conducted a training report session that was open to the public including the media. The event was covered by newspapers and published on the university's website.

■ Good Practices

- The 10 students dispatched to the U.S. not only studied at CBC and WSU, but also experienced American culture and customs firsthand by staying with the students and faculty members of these universities in their homes.
- We were able to hold a debriefing session on the field training in the Hanford area, which was open to the public including the media. This debriefing session was also organized as a related event to the signing ceremony for the collaborative agreement between the Fukushima Research and Education Institute (F-REI) and Educational Foundation Shouheiko overseeing HNIU.
